APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 95-01

TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED

WHEREAS, it has now been determined to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget.



SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and approval by the Mayor.





SYNOPSIS

This ordinance appropriates \$8,000 from the City of Bloomington Affordable Housing Fund to be awarded to Monroe County Housing Solutions Inc. The funds are to be used exclusively for down payment and closing cost assistance for low to moderate income home buyers who have completed Housing Solutions Community Homebuyers Assistance Program (CHAP) training, and are purchasing housing within the corporate city limits or in the Autumnview Community Land Trust.
