(Animal Shelter and Police Department)**

WHEREAS, it has now been determined to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation, the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart from the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:



SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and approval by the Mayor.





SYNOPSIS

The Animal Shelter request for medical supplies and equipment will eliminate projected shortfalls in these accounts, and are offset by corresponding budget savings in other accounts.

The Police Department request appropriates a grant received under the State's Drug Free Communities program. Monies received from counter-measure fees assessed to drunk drivers and drug offenders are divided between the counties (75%) and the State (25%). The monies retained by the county are administered by the Monroe County CARES board. The Police Department has been awarded a CARES grant in the amount of \$10,314 to be used for the purchase of three in-car video systems.
