RESOLUTION 94-50

SUPPORTING STATE AND FEDERAL MEASURES TO PROHIBIT THE MANDATING OF PROGRAMS WITHOUT PROVIDING A MEANS FOR FUNDING THEM

WHEREAS, local governments in Indiana operate under strict controls on local taxes; and

- WHEREAS, these strict controls include a limit on local tax increases, which since 1973 has severely constrained the ability of local governments to discharge their required functions effectively; and
- WHEREAS, recent unfunded state and federal mandates have aggravated the already serious funding problems for local governments in Indiana; and
- WHEREAS, the Indiana Association of Cities and Towns (IACT) acknowledged this problem in their Policy Resolution 4 for 1994, which urges Congress and the general assembly to enact legislation or initiate constitutional amendments which prohibit the enforcement of mandates without funding; and
- WHEREAS, Senators Kempthorne and Glenn and Representatives Conyers and Towns, have sponsored mandate relief legislation, the Federal Mandate Accountability and Reform Act (S. 993/H.R. 4771); and
- WHEREAS, this legislation is endorsed by the National League of Cities and all other organizations representing state and local governments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council supports the Federal Mandate Accountability and Reform Act (S. 993/H.R. 4771) and other measures by the General Assembly and the United States Congress to prohibit the enforcement of mandates without funding. In addition, we support the public education campaign of the National League of Cities and will assist them by keeping the citizens of Bloomington informed about the impact of federal mandates on our government and on them as taxpayers. We recognize October 24-30 as National Unfunded Mandates Week. A copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to appropriate state and federal officials and representatives.
