

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 94-01
TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE MUNICIPAL FACILITIES LEASE FUND
EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED
(\$675,000 of COIT for the Showers Project)

WHEREAS, it has now been determined to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation, the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart from the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance appropriates \$675,000 of County Option Income Tax (COIT) funds that have been set aside for the Showers Project. These funds may be used to tender a partial lease-purchase payment of \$337,500 towards bond obligations arising in 1994, to pay on-going project expenditures, and to reimburse the City for project related advances and expenditures already made out of the Non-reverting Improvement (Westside Industries) Fund.
