WHEREAS, It has now been determined to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget.



SYNOPSIS

The Police Department request would appropriate a \$9,500 reimbursement from Indiana University. The funds will be used for overtime expenses incurred by that department while directing traffic during Indiana University football games.

The Animal Control request will be used to reimburse veterinarians in the amount of \$1.00 for every license they process under our new cooperative program with local veterinarians. Under this program, veterinarians will be able to issue pet licenses directly to their patrons in addition to their regular services, thereby providing pet owners with more convenient 'one-stop' shopping. Costs of the program are expected to be offset by increases in pet licensing.

The \$425,000 Motor Vehicle Highway Fund appropriation is for construction engineering and change orders related to the South Walnut Phase II construction project now underway. The City is reimbursed 80% of the cost of this project from the Federal Highway Administration, so that the net cost to the City is \$85,000.

The \$1,000 Affordable Housing Fund request is for start-up costs for "CATCH", a community based organization dedicated to providing technical assistance and resources to enable low to moderate income residents to acquire co-operative housing. CATCH has also been awarded \$30,000 of CDBG funds through the Redevelopment Department for the acquisition of an affordable housing project.

The \$4,000 Rosehill Fund request is needed for higher than budgeted usage of fuel. The request will be offset by some salary savings within the department due to turnover in seasonal employees.

The \$73,500 Park Fund request appropriates an Indiana Department of Natural Resources - Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant (LWCF) awarded to the Parks and Recreation Department for the second phase of capital improvements to the Thomson Community Park. The specific improvements include constructing a new restroom, continuing to expand the existing hardsurface nature trail (1/4 mile), the placement of additional interpretive nature signs along the new section of the trail, the construction of a wildlife observation deck, improve the park's resource enhancement plan and implement a forest restoration program through the planting of 40 native oak trees. The reimbursable grant is awarded on a 50/50 matching basis. The City's match includes land donation (\$32,130) and in-kind Park Department labor (\$41,370).
