RESOLUTION 93-09

SUPPORTING STATE AND FEDERAL MEASURES TO PROHIBIT THE MANDATING OF PROGRAMS WITHOUT PROVIDING A MEANS FOR FUNDING THEM

WHEREAS, local governments in Indiana operate under strict controls on local taxes; and

WHEREAS, these strict controls include a limit on local tax increases, which since 1973 has severely constrained the ability of local governments to discharge their required functions effectively; and

WHEREAS, recent unfunded state and federal mandates have aggravated the already serious funding problems for local governments in Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the Indiana Association Cities and Towns (IACT) acknowledged this problem in their Policy Resolution 4 for 1993, which urges Congress and the General Assembly to enact legislation or initiate constitutional amendments which prohibit the enforcement of mandates without funding; and

WHEREAS, the 1993 Indiana Senate Joint Resolution 0007 would forbid the state from passing any mandates on local governments without the means with which to pay for them;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council supports Senate Joint Resolution 0007 and other measures by the General Assembly and the United States Congress to prohibit the enforcement of mandates without funding. A copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to appropriate state and federal officials and representatives.
