SYNOPSIS

When the 1993 Budget was put together, we had preliminary engineering on parking lot reconstruction at 7th and Walnut Streets, but not final engineering. At that time, it appeared that replacing the asphalt lot and repairing the concrete retaining wall would cost about \$75,000. It is now estimated to cost at least \$100,000. Therefore, we need to appropriate additional Parking Fine monies for the project bid.

In the MPO's Transportation Improvement Program, one of the Urbanized Area's top priorities is preliminary engineering on the Adams-3rd-5th Streets realignment. The Indiana Department of Transportation and Federal Highway Administration have approved the EIS Reevaluation on this project, and are ready to fund 80% of the costs of preliminary engineering. Since there is a current development proposal for some of the vacant right-of-way needed for this project, we should take advantage of the federal funds and complete the design as soon as possible. This appropriation would include the 80% federal grant (\$109,464) and the 20% local match (\$27,366).
