#### ORDINANCE 92 - 38

To Amend the Text of Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code in Order to Add Compliance with the Master Plan as a Criterion for Approval of Conditional Uses and Special Exceptions

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered and recommended that the Bloomington Municipal Code be changed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. In Chapter 20.10 REGULATIONS FOR CONDITIONAL USES, Section 20.10.01.00 Purpose shall be renumbered as 20.10.00.00.

SECTION II. A new Section 20.10.01.00 shall then be added and shall read as follows:

#### 20.10.01.00 General Regulations and Conditions

20.10.01.01 Hearing. The Plan Commission shall hold a public hearing on each requested use.

20.10.01.02 Conditions. The Plan Commission may impose any conditions and restrictions deemed necessary to insure compatibility with the surrounding area.

20.10.01.03 Landscaping. The Plan Commission shall determine that adequate landscaping and buffering are provided where appropriate.

20.10.01.04 General Restrictions. The Plan Commission shall not grant conditional use approval of any use which it deems to be objectionable due to potential pedestrian or vehicular traffic, noise, pollution, odor, or any other condition which might interfere with the general health, safety, and welfare of the surrounding area.

20.10.01.05 Plan Compliance. The Plan Commission shall not grant conditional approval of any use which is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan or which interferes with the achievement of the goals and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan.

SECTION III. In Chapter 20.11 REGULATIONS FOR SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS, <u>Section 20.11.01.00 General Regulations and Conditions</u> shall be amended to read as follows:

#### 20.11.01.00 General Regulations and Conditions

20.11.01.01 Investigation. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall request a recommendation from the Plan Commission or their agent which shall investigate each proposed use to determine that it is properly related to adjacent land uses and with other uses permitted in the zone.

20.11.01.02 Hearing. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall hold a public hearing on each requested use.

20.11.01.03 Special Conditions. The Board of Zoning Appeals may impose such conditions and restrictions deemed necessary to insure compatibility with the surrounding area.

20.11.01.04 Landscaping. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall determine that adequate landscaping and buffering are provided where appropriate.

20.11.01.05 General Restrictions. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall not grant a special exception for any use which it deems to be objectionable due to potential pedestrian or vehicular traffic, noise, pollution, odor, or

any other condition which might interfere with the general health, safety, and welfare of the surrounding area.

20.11.01.06 Plan Compliance. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall not grant a special exception for any use which is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan or which interferes with the achievement of the goals and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan.

20.11.01.07 Abatement. If at any time, the person who has been issued a special exception carries on an operation which is not in accord with the above standards or interferes with the general welfare of the surrounding area, the Board of Zoning Appeals shall have cause to terminate this special permit.

SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence or provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other parts of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid part, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
