ORDINANCE 92-65 To Amend the Outline Plan Re: 1845 S. Covey Lane (Huntington Renaissance Partners, Petitioner)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, RS/PUD-84-92, and recommended that the petitioner, Huntington Renaissance Partners be granted an amendment to the outline plan and request that the Common Council consider their petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 and pursuant to Chapter 20.13 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, that an outline plan amendment be approved for 1845 S. Covey Lane, Bloomington, Indiana. The property is further described as follows:

The West half of the following described real estate: Forty (40) feet off of the South side of Lot Eighty-two (82) and One Hundred (100) feet off of the North side of Lot Eighty-three (83), in Huntington Park, a subdivision of a part of the Northeast quarter of Section 9, and a part of the Northwest quarter of Section 10, all in Township 8 North, Range 1 West.

ALSO, a part of Lot Number Eighty-three (83) in Huntington Park, a subdivision to the City of Bloomington, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point $93\frac{1}{2}$ feet North of the Southwest corner of said Lot Number Eighty-three (83); thence running East $154\frac{1}{2}$ feet; thence running North $93\frac{1}{2}$ feet; thence running West $154\frac{1}{2}$ feet; thence running South $93\frac{1}{2}$ feet to the place of beginning.

SECTION II. The Outline Plan Amendment, as recommended by the Plan Commission, shall be attached hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
