TO AUTHORIZE USE OF THE SPECIAL NON-REVERTING FUND II TO AUGMENT THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND, PROVIDE EMERGENCY SOCIAL SERVICES AND ADVANCE MONEY TO IMPROVE THOMSON PARK

- WHEREAS, the Bloomington Common Council adopted Ordinance 80-70, "To Create A Special Non-Reverting Fund" to account for monies received by the City of Bloomington ("City") pursuant to certain In Lieu of Annexation agreements approved by the Common Council in Ordinance 80-68 and Ordinance 80-69; and
- WHEREAS, the Bloomington Common Council adopted Ordinance 92-45 which provides that monies in said fund may be advanced by the City for capital projects in anticipation of the receipt of tax revenues or in anticipation of the issuance of bonds; and after receipt of said revenues or upon issuance of said bonds, said advances shall be repaid into the fund; and
- WHEREAS, Ordinance 92-45 further provides that monies in said fund may be used by the City to make advances and loans, through the Affordable Housing Fund created by Resolution 91-25, to facilitate the development and construction of affordable housing within the City, provided that said advances and loans shall be repaid to the Affordable Housing Fund; and
- WHEREAS, Ordinance 92-45 further provides that monies in said fund may be used by the City for community and social services; and
- WHEREAS, the City intends that this resolution constitute a declaration of official intent pursuant to Treas. Reg. Sec. 1.103-18 (1992).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. The Common Council of the City of Bloomington hereby approves and authorizes expenditures from the Special Non-Reverting Improvement Fund II in an amount not to exceed threehundred-thousand dollars (\$300,000) for the design and construction and other expenses relating to the improvements at Thomson Park; and that the City declares its official intent pursuant to Treas. Reg. Sec. 1.103-18 (1992) to construct the park and intends to reimburse the Special Non-Reverting Fund II for money advanced towards the costs of said park with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the City, or in the alternative, with future Tax Increment revenues, as revenues become available. These Tax Increment revenues are derived from the Thomson economic development and allocation areas established in the City for the purpose of funding improvements that benefit these areas. These Tax Increment revenues are intended to pay for these improvements either directly or by repaying the debt incurred or by reimbursing advances made for these improvements.

The use of the funds from the Special Non-Reverting Improvement Fund is consistent with the City's budgetary and financial circumstances and the City does not reasonably expect that those funds would be available to pay the costs of the project on a long term basis. The funds to be advanced to pay the costs of the project are intended to be used on a long term basis for interim financing of various projects of the City to enable the City to begin capital projects prior to the completion of long-term financing.

SECTION II. The Common Council of the City of Bloomington hereby approves and authorizes an operating transfer from the Special Non-Reverting Improvement Fund II in an amount not to exceed three-hundred-thousand dollars (\$300,000) to the

Affordable Housing Fund created by Resolution 91-25, to be used by the City to make advances and loans, to facilitate the development and construction of affordable housing within the City, provided that said advances and loans shall be repaid to the Affordable Housing Fund.

SECTION III. The Common Council of the City of Bloomington hereby approves and authorizes an operating transfer from the Special Non-Reverting Improvementund II in an amount not to exced sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) to the General Fund to be used by the City, after approval of the Common Council, for emergency community and social services.

SECTION IV. This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and approval by the Mayor.

SECTION V. Severability. If any section, sentence, or provision of this resolution, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other sections, sentences, provisions, or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this resolution are declared to be severable.

SYNOPSIS

This Resolution authorizes expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$ 665,000 from the Special Non-Reverting Improvement Fund II for: 1) the advancement of construction costs incurred in connection with Thomson park improvements (\$300,000); 2) an operating transfer to the Affordable Housing fund to be used for advances and loans (\$300,000); and, 3) an operating transfer to the General fund to be used to fund community and social service expenditures included in the 1993 budget (\$65,000).

1. Amend SECTION III of the "NOW, THEREFORE, ... " portion of the resolution so that it now reads:

SECTION III. The Common Council of the City of Bloomington hereby approves and authorizes an operating transfer from the Special Non-Reverting Improvement Fund II in an amount not to exceed sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) to the General Fund to be used by the City, after approval of the Common Council, for emergency community and social services.

2. Amend the "NOW THEREFORE,.." portion of the resolution by adding SECTION V that reads as follows:

SECTION V. Severability. If any section, sentence, or provision of this resolution, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other sections, sentences, provisions, or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this resolution are declared to be severable.

SYNOPSIS

This amendment restates an understanding reached between the City Administration and the Common Council, where the City will obtain approval of the Council before spending the money for emergency community or social services. This amendment also includes a standard "severability clause" which saves other provisions of the legislation if one is declared invalid.
