ORDINANCE 91-17

TO AMEND THE TEXT OF TITLE 20 OF THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE  
REGULATING SIGNS

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered and recommended that the Bloomington Municipal Code be changed:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:


SECTION I. Section 20.17.02.02(d) Total sign allocations based upon building mass and street frontage in business and industrial zones shall be amended to read as follows:

20.17.02.02(d) Only property with frontage on an arterial or principal collector street in the (B) Business or (M) Manufacturing zones shall be allowed pole or ground signs. One pole or one ground sign shall be permitted for each street frontage. Maximum permitted size of any pole or ground sign shall not exceed 72 sq. ft. per sign face including any changeable readerboard. There shall be a maximum of two (2) sign faces per sign.


SECTION II. Severability. If any section, sentence or provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other parts of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid part, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.





Re: Sign Code Amendment

This amendment is a housekeeping matter that the staff wishes to take care of. The current code is silent in regard to the number and/or size of ground signs allowed for business or manufacturing zoned properties. At present there is no limit on the number or size of ground signs that may be erected on a site other than the overall square footage allotment for the property. This amendment would place the same restrictions on ground signs that are currently in place for pole signs. One pole or ground sign per principal street frontage would be allowed for eligible properties. The size of the sign would be limited to 72 sq. ft. per side with up to two sign faces allowed per sign.
