ORDINANCE 91 - 46
To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps
Re: Prospect Hill District

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, HP-30-91, and recommended that the Prospect Hill District be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning Maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be amended to designate property "Historic" for the property located at Prospect Hill, McPheeter's, and Henry Steele Additions more particularly described as follows:

Original Plat of Bloomington: Lot 65, Part Lot 66, Lots 71 and 72;

McPheeter's Addition: Lots 1, 3, 5, 7, Part Lot 9, Lots 11, 13, and 15;

Prospect Hill Addition: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15;

Henry Steele Addition: Outlot 1

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
