RESOLUTION 91-20

TO APPROVE APPLICATION OF THE FEDERAL SECTION 8 HOUSING PROVISIONS TO THE BLOOMINGTON HOUSING AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Title II, Section 201 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383), amending the Housing Act of 1937, local housing authorities may receive financial assistance through the Section 8 "Lower Income Housing Assistance" program for the purpose of providing low-rent housing by leasing dwelling units in privately owned structures; and


WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Bloomington is coordinating the Housing Voucher Program and is applying for the following:
13 Rental Rehabilitation Certificates/Vouchers
40 Single Room Occupancy Certificates/Vouchers
10 Operation Boot Strap Certificates/Vouchers
15 Project Based Certificates/Vouchers; and

WHEREAS, such provisions may not apply to any locality unless the governing body of the locality has by resolution approved the application of such provisions to such locality;




