A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST

- WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana to protect the well-being of our community from disruption; and
- WHEREAS, the experience of our community is that war threatens the tranquility of our citizenry; and
- WHEREAS, the United States now has nearly a half million soldiers poised for combat in the Middle East; and
- WHEREAS, the President has made manifest his serious consideration to initiate combat; and
- WHEREAS, such a war would jeopardize our community through loss of lives from our City, County and University and from cities throughout the nation and the world, through disruption of oil supplies, and through polarization of our body politic as has not been seen for a generation; and
- WHEREAS, the hope for a new world order, symbolized by the destruction of the Berlin Wall, must not be destroyed by hasty resort to armed conflict;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council urges the President of the United States to refrain from any further dispatch of troops or preparation for war unless the United States Senate and House of Representatives authorize such steps. Further, the Council calls for a renewed development of a national alternative energy policy and urges our citizenry and governments at every level to initiate every possible step to reduce our overconsumption of and dependence on oil.
