

ORDINANCE 89 - 5

To Amend the Zoning Maps from RS to SM
RE: 637 S. Walker St. (DMR Development Corp.)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-1-89, and recommended that the petitioner, DMR Development Corp., be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RS to SM for property located at 637 S. Walker St., and more particularly described as follows:


Part of Seminary Lot Number Sixty (60) in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point Three Hundred Thirty (330) feet South of the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot #60; running thence East One Hundred Fifty (150) feet; thence running South One Hundred Nine (109) feet; thence running West One Hundred Fifty (150) feet; thence running North One Hundred Nine (109) feet to the place of beginning.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.





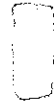
