RESOLUTION 89-38

TO EXPRESS COUNCIL SUPPORT FOR AN INDIANA RECYCLING GRANT APPLICATION

- WHEREAS, as a country we throw away enough aluminum to rebuild the entire commercial airfleet every three months; and
- WHEREAS, as a country we throw away enough glass to fill the World Trade Towers every two weeks; and
- WHEREAS, each of us disposes of about three pounds of trash per day, as much as 50 percent of that being paper products; and
- WHEREAS, yard waste and other compostibles comprise as much as 25% of our landfills; and
- WHEREAS, all of these are or can be valuable resources if recycled or composted; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington has implemented and supported curbside collection and dropsites of the aforementioned items; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington continues to look for innovative and effective means of solid waste management; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington now has the opportunity to expand these projects with the support of the state through its Indiana Recycling Grants program:


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council supports the grant application filed jointly by the City and Monroe County which would allow expansion of composting; provision of curbside containers for 1,000 city residents; dropsites for recyclables at the county dump sites; more dropsites at city grocery stores; and forums for businesses to share successful waste reduction methods. Further, the Common Council supports the allocation of funds for the City's matching portion of the grant.


