

To Vacate a Public Parcel
 RE: east half of east/west alley in block
 bounded by College, Walnut, 4th & 5th
 (CFC, Inc.)

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, CFC, INC. has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property in the block bounded by College, Walnut, 4th and 5th; and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City-owned property in the block bounded by College, Walnut, 4th & 5th shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:


Part of the east half of an east-west alley in the City of Bloomington, County of Monroe, State of Indiana: Beginning at a point located at the southeast corner of in-lot 125, thence south twelve (12) feet to the northeast corner of in-lot 92, thence west over and along the north lot line of in-lot 92 One Hundred Thirty-Two (132) feet to the northwest corner of in-lot 92, thence north twelve (12) feet to the southwest corner of in-lot 126, thence east over and along the south lot line of in-lot 126 and in-lot 125 One Hundred Thirty-Two (132) feet to the southeast corner of in-lot 125, and the place of beginning, of the original plat of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.




