

RESOLUTION 86-29

To Approve Application of the Federal Section 8 Housing Provisions to the Bloomington Housing Authority

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Title II-Section 201 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383), amending the Housing Act of 1937, local housing authorities may receive financial assistance through the Section 8 "Lower Income Housing Assistance" program for the purpose of providing low-rent housing by leasing dwelling units in privately owned structures; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Bloomington is coordinating the Housing Voucher Program and is applying for approval of ten rental rehabilitation vouchers; and

WHEREAS, such provisions may not apply to any locality unless the governing body of the locality has by resolution approved the application of such provisions to such locality;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The provisions of Title II Section 201 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383), amending the United States Housing Act of 1937, relating to the Section 8 "Lower Income Housing Assistance" program shall be applicable to the Housing Authority of the City of Bloomington, Indiana; and approval of ten rental rehabilitation vouchers is hereby granted.
