

RESOLUTION 86- 30

TO DESIGNATE AUGUST 12, 1986
CIVIL RIGHTS DAY IN BLOOMINGTON

WHEREAS, more than 250 mayors and governors nationwide have pledged to issue proclamations declaring Civil Rights Day August 12, 1986; and

WHEREAS, the Bloomington Common Council desires to celebrate the past accomplishments of the Civil Rights movement and to reaffirm its commitment to the continuing struggle to achieve the ideal of equality and equal opportunity throughout Bloomington and the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Bloomington Human Rights Commission has requested the Council to raise its voice in concert with human rights advocates across the nation.



August 12, 1986 shall be designated Civil Rights Day in the City of Bloomington.


