To Vacate a Public Parcel - James Ridge (816 Anna Lee Lane)

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

- WHEREAS, the petitioner, James Ridge, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property on the alley West of Anna Lee Lane; and
- WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommedation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City owned property on the alley West of Anna Lee Lane shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:

A part of Seminary Lots 185 & 188, in Bloomington, Indiana. Beginning at a point that is 173 feet North and 614 feet East of the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot #188; thence South for a distance of 194 feet; thence running West for a distance of 355.3 feet; thence running North for a distance of 194 feet; thence running EAst for a distance of 355.3 and to the place of beginning. Containing in all 1.58 acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor,
