

ORDINANCE 85 - 11

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, from RS to BA
RE: 1205 W. 2nd Street (Chuck Stephenson)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-1-85, and recommended that the petitioner, CHUCK STEPHENSON, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning maps and requests that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RS to BA for property located at the south side of West Second Street and along the west side of the I.C.G. Railroad tracks, and more further described as:


A part of Seminary Lot Number One Hundred Fifty-three (153) in Monroe County, Indiana, described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot Number One Hundred Fifty-three (153), running thence East to the West right-of-way line of the Bloomington Southern Railroad, as it now runs, thence South along and with the said west right-of-way line of said Railroad to the South line of said Seminary Lot number One Hundred Fifty-three (153), thence North to the place of beginning, same being all of that part of said Seminary Lot number One hundred Fifty-three (153), lying West of the Bloomington Southern Railroad West right-of-way line.

also:

Certain property forming a portion of the right-of-way of the Illinois Central Gulf Railroad Company's Bloomington Southern District, said property situated in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 5, Township 8 North, Range 1 West of the Second Principal Meridian at Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, is described as follows: Begin a Grantor's property corner situated 790 feet North and 679 feet West from the Southeast corner of said Quarter/Quarter, and run N 3 30' W, to Grantor's property corner in a line parallel with and 50 feet normally distant Southwesterly from the centerline to Grantor's main track; Thence Northwesterly along said parallel line, to the centerline of State Hwy. No. 45; Thence Northeasterly along said "Highway" centerline (said "Highway" centerline intersecting said main track centerline Thence Southeasterly along the last said parallel line, 200 feet to a point; Thence Southwesterly at a right angle to the last described course 25 feet to a line parallel with and 50 feet normally distant Southwesterly from said main track centerline; Thence Northwesterly along the last said parallel line, to Grantor's property corner in the North line of the South 790 feet of the aforesaid Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter; Thence West along said North line, to retrace to the Point of Beginning.


SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
