A part of the Southeast Quarter of Section Thirteen (13), Township Eight (8) North, Range Two (2) West, bounded and described as follows; to-wit: Commencing at a point that is one hundred eight (108) rods North and One hundred sixty (160) rods West of the Southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of said Section, Town and Range; thence running South along and with the center line of the Leonard Springs Road for a distance of Ten (10) rods (165 feet); thence East Thirty two (32) rods (528 feet) thence North Ten (10) rods (165) feet thence west Thirty two rods (32) (528 feet) and to the place of beginning. Containing Two (2) acres, more or less.
