## ORDINANCE 85-24

TO AMEND THE 1985 SALARY ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF UTILITIES EMPLOYEES

OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, FOR THE POSITION OF

SOLIDS HANDLING SPECIALIST.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

SECTION I. That from and after the \_\_\_\_\_ day of May, 1985, pursuant to I.C. 36-4-8-3, the following classified position, salary, and pay schedule for the Treatment Operations be incorpor ated into Section I of Ordinance 84-38, fixing the salaries of Utilities Employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

## TREATMENT OPERATIONS

Solids Handling Specialist \$17,000.

SECTION II. That from and after the day of May, 1985, the following position, salary, and pay schedule for Solids Handling Specialist be incorporated into Section II of Ordinance 84-38, Salary Ordinance for Utilities Employees of the City of Bloomington:

19	Solids Handling Specialist	\$17,000.

SECTION III. The rate shown as wage and salary for the position listed above is the maximum rate.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends the 1985 Salary Ordinance, Fixing the Salaries of Utilities Employees. The construction of the Solids Handling Facility was recently completed and is now ready for on line use, which creates the need for a Solids Handling Specialist.

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## SOLIDS HANDLING SPECIALIST

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Oversees the operations of the solids disposal operations. Does related work as required.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The employee in this class is responsible for proper operation of digesters, sludge lagoons and dredge, sludge drying beds, grit removal, centrifuges, rotatory screens, and related equipment. Supervision is exercised over mechanical equipment operator III.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Trains seasonal and temporary employees;

Trains shift operators on the proper operation of the centrifuges;

Hauls or pumps dewatered or thickened sludge to lagoons or drying beds;

Keeps equipment clean;

Operates centrifuges, dredges, and other equipment when needed;

Keeps areas clean such as, sludge areas, haul roads, drying beds,

centrifuge building, polymer building;

Schedule with supervisors a preventative maintenance program and down time of equipment;

Performs chemical evaluations on dewatering chemicals;

Performs biological and chemical testing on digesting sludges and dewatered

sludge;

Complete daily, monthly, and yearly reports.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Thorough knowledge of modern wastewater treatment plant principles and operating practices; ability to plan and supervise the work of others; ability to keep accurate records and make concise reports; good judgment; good physical condition.

ACCEPTABLE EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING: Considerable experience in wastewater treatment plant operations. Completion of standard high school course, preferably supplemented with chemistry or related subjects; or any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the required knowledge, skills and abilities.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: Possession of a Class II Wastewater Treatment Operator's Certificate by the State Board of Health is desirable.
