

ORDINANCE 85-34

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps from RL to BA
RE: 2425 S. Walnut (Bloomington Lincoln Mercury)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO/DP-45-85, and recommended that the petitioner, BLOOMINGTON LINCOLN-MERCURY-DATSUN, INC., be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning maps and requests that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, Monroe COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RL to BA for property located at 2425 S. Walnut, and more further described as:

That portion of the real estate owned by the Wylie heirs commencing at the intersection of the south property line of the First National Bank real estate and South Walnut Street, then extending approximately Four Hundred Feet (400') south along South Walnut Street, then west to the east bank of Clear Creek, then north Four Hundred Feet (400'), and then east to the point of beginning.


Also including the real estate immediately south of the above-referenced tract, that lies between the west right-of-way line of the Old State Highway 37 South and the east bank of Clear Creek, running to the north property line of the real estate conveyed to Walnut Park Development, excepting therefrom the real estate owned by Samuel Wellman and Janice Wellman, husband and wife.

Also including the real estate owned by the Wylie heirs located due west of the west property line of the First National Bank of Bloomington, Indiana, extending west to the east bank of Clear Creek.

Also including the real estate owned by the Wylie heirs located between the real estate commonly known as Gib and Denzil's Restaurant and the north property line of the First National Bank of Bloomington, Indiana, extending to the east bank of Clear Creek.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.


