

ORDINANCE 85 - 36

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps from RE to PCD
And Grant Outline Approval for the PCD

RE: Hillside Drive West of Maxwell Street (Sarkes Tarzian, Inc.)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case DP/PCD-53-85, and recommended that the petitioner, SARKES TARZIAN, INC., be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and requests that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RE to ~~BL~~/PCD for property located on Hillside Drive West of Maxwell Street, and more accurately described as follows:

A part of Seminary Lot 136, Bloomington, Indiana, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the West line of said Seminary Lot 136, said point being 555.02 feet S00° -44' -25"E of the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot 136, thence East for a distance of 29.54 feet, thence S88° -28' -44"E for a distance of 463.59 feet, thence S00° -44' -25"E for a distance of 760.93 feet to the centerline of Hillside drive, thence N88° -59' -16"W over and along the centerline of said Hillside Drive for a distance of 493.00 feet to the Southwest corner of said Seminary Lot 136, thence N00° -44' -25"W over and along the West line of said Seminary Lot 136 for a distance of 764.53 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 8.63 acres, more or less.

SECTION II. Through the authority of IC 36-7-4 and pursuant to Chapter 20.13 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, that an outline plan be approved and that the above described parcel be designated a planned commercial development.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor.
