

ORDINANCE 85 - 44
To Vacate a Public Parcel
RE: (120 West Seventh - Downtown Redevelopment
Group)

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Downtown Redevelopment Group has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property at 120 W. Seventh Street and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City-owned property at 120 W. Seventh Street shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of Lot #314 Plat Book 1, page 4 in the Office of the Recorder of Monroe County, Indiana; thence North 89 degrees 44 minutes 29 seconds West along the North line of Lot #314 23.52 feet; thence North 00 degrees 15 minutes 31 seconds East 0.26 feet; thence South 89 degrees 44 minutes 29 seconds East 24.30 feet; thence South 00 degrees 15 minutes 31 seconds West 15.00 feet; thence South 89 degrees 44 minutes 29 seconds East 0.30 feet; thence South 00 degrees 15 minutes 31 seconds West 54.5 feet; thence North 89 degrees 44 minutes 29 seconds West 1.0 feet; thence South 2 degrees 11 minutes 58 seconds East 24.02 feet; thence North 89 degrees 44 minutes 29 seconds West 0.16 feet to the East line of Lot #313, thence North 00 degrees 19 minutes 30 seconds West along the East line of Lots 313 and 314 93.24 feet to the point of beginning containing 46.68 square feet more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
