

ORDINANCE 85 - 47
To Vacate a Public Parcel
RE: North half of north/south alley between
College, Walnut, 4th, 5th (CFC, Inc.)

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, CFC, INC. has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property on the north half of the north/south alley between College, Walnut, 4th and 5th Streets, and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City-owned property at the north half of the north/south alley between College, Walnut, 4th, and 5th shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:

the north half of the 12 foot alley right-of-way contiguous with City of Bloomington In-lots number 125, 126, 127, 128 all in Township 9 North Range 1 West and recorded in the office of the Recorder of Monroe County, Indiana.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
