

ORDINANCE 84- 1

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7,, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-74-83, and recommended that the petitioner, AMERICAN MOVING AND STORAGE, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning Maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from BA to ML for property located at 1821 West Third Street, more particularly described as follows:

A part of Seminary Lot Number One Hundred Seventy-nine (179) and One Hundred Eighty (180), being a part of Section Six (6), Township Eight (8) North, Range One (1) West, in Monroe County, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point that is Twenty (20) feet South and Six Hundred Sixteen and Sixty-nine hundredths (616.69) feet East of the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot Number One Hundred Eighty (180) and on the South right-of-way of State Route #48; thence East along the State right-of-way for Three Hundred Forty and Thirty-one hundredths (340.31) feet; thence leaving the right-of-way and running South Two (02) degrees Fifty-nine (59) minutes East for Six Hundred Forty (640.0) feet, thence North Eighty-seven (87) degrees Thirty-two (32) minutes West for Three Hundred Forty and Thirty-one hundredths (340.31) feet, thence North Two (02) degrees Fifty-nine (59) minutes West for Six Hundred Thirty-one and Thirty hundredths (631.30) feet and to the point of beginning. Containing in all Five (5.00) acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
