

ORDINANCE 84-13

To Vacate a Public Parcel

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Monroe County Jail, Law Enforcement & Governmental Space Building Corporation, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property on the east half of the east-west alley between W. Seventh and W. Eighth serving Morton to College Streets; and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City-owned property described as the east half of the east-west alley serving Morton and College and located between W. Seventh and W. Eighth shall be vacated.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
