

ORDINANCE 84-20

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 2.12.030 (10) TO REQUIRE THAT, FOR DETERMINATIONS MADE BY THE BOARD OF HOUSING QUALITY APPEALS, FOUR (4) CONCURRING VOTES BE REQUIRED.

WHEREAS, the number of members serving on the Bloomington Board of Housing Quality Appeals was increased from five (5) to seven (7) by Ordinance 83-6, Section 2; and

WHEREAS, by oversight, the number of members required to concur in voting in order to constitute a Board determination was left at three (3) members;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA THAT:

Section 1. The first sentence only of Bloomington Municipal Code Section 2.12.030 (10), Board Decision, shall be deleted and the sentence below inserted in its place.

Four (4) concurring votes are required for a Board determination.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, and approved by the Mayor.
