To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

In Lots number 217, 218, 219, 220, 269, 270, 271, 272, 273, 274 to the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
