

ORDINANCE 84 -366

To Vacate a Public Parcel

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, KATHLEEN JOHNSON, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property on the alley between 1011 and 1013 West Eleventh Street; and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City owned property on the alley between 1011 and 1013 West Eleventh Street shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:

Alley between Miller and Rice Addition, Lot #13, and Miller and Rice Addition, Lot #12.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
