

TO AMEND TITLE 2 OF THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE
REGARDING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW

WHEREAS, Indiana Code §36-4-9-4 provides that the City of Bloomington may establish a Department of Law;

WHEREAS, Indiana Code §36-4-9-6 provides that the Mayor shall appoint a Corporation Counsel; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code §36-4-9-11 provides that the Corporation Counsel is the head of the Department of Law; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code §36-4-9-11 provides that the Corporation Counsel's first deputy shall be the City Attorney, and the Corporation Counsel's second deputy shall be the Assistant City Attorney;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, THAT:

SECTION I. Section 2.21.000 of the Bloomington Municipal Code shall be revised to delete the following:

There is hereby created a Department of Law which shall be responsible for all legal matters pertaining to the City and its executive branch pursuant to statute. The Department of Law shall be directed by the City Attorney.


The following entry shall be added to Section 2.21.000 of the Bloomington Municipal Code:

There is hereby created a Department of Law which shall be responsible for all legal matters pertaining to the City and its executive branch pursuant to statute. The Department of Law shall be directed by the Corporation Counsel. The Corporation Counsel's first deputy shall be the City Attorney. The Corporation Counsel's second deputies shall be Assistant City Attorneys.

SECTION II. Severability. If any section of this Ordinance or any part of any section shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining parts.



SYNOPSIS

This Ordinance brings the Bloomington Municipal Code into compliance with Indiana Code §§36-4-9-6 and 36-4-9-11, by providing that the Mayor shall appoint the Corporation Counsel, and that the Corporation Counsel shall be the Director of the Department of Law. The Corporation Counsel's first deputy shall be the City Attorney. The Corporation Counsel's second deputies shall be Assistant City Attorneys.
