To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-53-84, and recommended that the petitioner, BILL BROWN & RICHARD BARTLETT, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RS (Residential Single Family) to RL (Residential Low Density) for property located in the 700 block of Winslow Road, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the west line of Lot 131, Sherwood Oaks Section Three, a recorded plat, said point being 19.26 feet south of the northwest corner of said Lot 131; thence northerly along the west line and west line extended of Sherwood Oaks Section Six, a recorded plat, to the centerline of Winslow Road as shown on said plat; then westerly 150.00 feet along said centerline; thence southerly and parallel to the west line of Sherwood Oaks Section Six, 1,335.00 feet more or less to the north line of Sherwood Oaks Section Three; thence easterly 150.00 feet along said north line to the place of beginning, containing therein 4.6 acres.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
