

ORDINANCE 84 - 52

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps from BG to RM
re: 311 West 17th Street (Jim Burks)

WHEREAS the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commisison has considered this case, ZO-54-84, and recommended that the petitioner, JIM BURKS, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning Maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from BG (General Business) to RM (Residential Medium Density) for property locted at 311 West 17th Street, and more particularly described as follows:

Lot Number 15 in Kenwood Park Addition to the City of Bloomington, Indiana.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
