

ORDINANCE 84 - 57

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps from BA to ML
Re: 2301 S. Walnut (Ray Stahl)

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-59-84, and recommended that the petitioner, RAY STAHL, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC-18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from BA (Arterial Business) to ML (Light Manufacturing) for property located at 2301 South Walnut, and more particularly described as follows:

A part of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section Nine (9), Township Eight (8) North, Range One (1) West, Monroe County, Indiana, described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point that is One Hundred Twenty-three and Twenty-three Hundredths (123.23) feet South and Eight Hundred Fifty-eight and Fifty-nine Hundredths (858.59) feet West of the Northeast corner of said quarter quarter; thence South Two (02) degrees Forty-four (44) minutes Thirty-eight (38) seconds East for a distance of Two Hundred Fifty-two and Fifty-four Hundredths (252.54) feet; thence South Eighty-nine (89) degrees Fourteen (14) minutes Fourteen (14) seconds East for Forty-four and Five Hundredths (44.05) feet, thence South Eighty-nine (89) degrees (Forty-eight (48) minutes Eighteen (18) seconds East for a distance of Two Hundred Eighty-four and Sixty Hundredths (284.60) feet; thence North Zero (00) degrees Forty-three (43) minutes Sixteen (16) seconds West for a distance of Two Hundred Fifty-one and Twenty-three Hundredths (251.23) feet, thence North Eighty-nine (89) degrees Thirty-four (34) minutes West for a distance of Three Hundred Thirty-seven and Fifty-nine Hundredths (337.59) feet to the place of beginning, containing One and Ninety-three Hundredths (1.93) acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
