

RESOLUTION 84-13

A Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Bloomington in Support of
Senate Bill 1578 "Local Government Anti-Trust Act"

WHEREAS: Since the 1982 Boulder Decision, local governments have faced potential threats to their communities as a result of the lack of anti-trust protection; and


WHEREAS: The National League of Cities and Indiana Association of Cities and Towns have urged cities and towns to support congressional action to protect actions of a municipality from the growing number of anti-trust suits as a result of the Boulder decision;

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1578 sponsored by Senator Strom Thurmond, or similar legislation to protect local governments should be supported and passed by the United States Congress in order to amend the anti-trust law to establish a municipal action exemption similar to the immunity of the states;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council hereby urges its Indiana Senators and Congressmembers to vote for S. 1578 or other legislation that would amend the anti-trust law to establish a municipal action exemption similar to the immunity of the states, and asks that these Senators and Congressional Representatives work toward quick passage of such legislation to protect local governments from anti-trust suits.


