RESOLUTION 84-21

To Bring Negotiations with Westinghouse to a Conclusion

WHEREAS, since January, 1984, attorneys for the City and for Westing-house Corporation have been involved in extended negotiations to arrive at a Consent Decree to resolve the pending PCB litigation; and

WHEREAS, the City must proceed, as quickly as possible, to resolve the PCB problem, so that the confidence of the community will not be eroded by further delays as a result of protracted negotiations; and

WHEREAS, we have been told many times in the last few months that this Consent Decree is "just around the corner", and frustration and confusion in the community is mounting while the pending litigation has been on hold to allow for negotiations:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, that:

If attorneys for the City of Bloomington can not reach a final settlement in the negotiations on the proposed Consent Decree with Westinghouse Corporation within two weeks of the date of this Resolution, City attorneys should take immediate steps to bring the matter to trial as soon as possible and without further delay.
