TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE PARKS AND RECREATION FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED BY THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart from the fund herein named and for the purpose as herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same;

SYNOPSIS

Additional funds are needed in the professional services line item to pay the City's share (50%) of a study to be undertaken jointly with the County to survey origins of present park facility uses (in-city vs. out-of city). The 22,500 appropriation in the consulting services line appropriates a 15,000 UPARR Grant plus 7,500 match money from Indiana University to be added to the 7,500 local match currently budgeted in the Parks and Recreation Budget for a long-range use and management plan for Lake Griffy. An additional 27,154 was granted for renovation of Bryan Pool bringing the total federal contribution to 45,000. The 27,154 plus an additional 846.00 from the Parks and Recreation fund operating balance brings the total pool renovation appropriation to 278,000 consistent with the lowest bid.
