

ORDINANCE 83-7

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-9-83, and recommended that the petitioner, Doyle Newquist be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RL (Residential Low Density) to BA (Business Arterial) for property located at 3709 W. Third St. more particularly described as follows:

A part of the Northeast quarter of Section 1, Township 8 North, Range 2 West, in Monroe County, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point on the North line of said Northeast quarter that stands 29 rods and 60 feet east of the northwest corner of said quarter Section, thence south parallel to the west line of said quarter Section 18 rods and 13 feet, thence east parallel to the North line of said quarter Section 8 rods and to the southwest corner of land heretofore conveyed to the grantors herein, thence North 18 rods and 13 feet to the North line of said quarter Section and to the northwest corner of land heretofore conveyed to the grantors herein, thence west 8 rods to the place of beginning; Containing 1 acre, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

This ordinance would rezone 1 acre of currently RL zoned land with existing building to BA. Third, is bounded by BA zoning to the west, ML/MG/PUD to the north, and RL to the east and south.
