## ORDINANCE 83-20

## To Amend Section 4.04.110 of the Bloomington Municipal Code

## Entitled "Lunch Wagon"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Section 4.04.110 of Title 4 of the Bloomington Municipal Code entitled "Lunch Wagon" shall be amended to read as follows:

4.04.110 Lunch wagon. It is unlawful for any person to operate on the public streets and alleys, within the city for gain or profit, any wagon, motor or other vehicle, selling or offering for sale articles of food and drink, commonly known and designated as a lunch wagon, without first obtaining a license to do so. The fee for such license shall be five dollars per day. Provided further, that a foot-propelled bicycle from which only ice cream confections are vended shall not be considered a lunch wagon for purposes of this section. The owner of such vehicle shall pay an annual license fee as follows: Twentyfive dollars for the first bicycle so operated, and five dollars for each subsequent bicycle.

SECTION II. Severability. If any section of this ordinance or any part of any section shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional such delcaration shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, upon this  $\gtrsim 0$  day of Optice 1983.

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends the Bloomington Municipal Code to provide that owners of bicycles from which ice cream confections are vended will pay an annual license fee of \$25 for the first bicycle and \$5 for each additional bicycle.
