

To Vacate a Public Parcel

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Kenneth Nunn, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of city property on College Avenue, and

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:


SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of city owned property on College Avenue shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows: A strip of land one foot by sixty-six feet running parallel and along with College Avenue, located directly in front of In-lot 89, City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, as recorded in Book J, pages 12-16, Office of the Recorder. Said right-of-way vacation would consist of an area of land one foot deep and 66 feet long fronting on College Avenue, running parallel to College Avenue; said area being on the west side of In-lot 89, and containing 66 square feet.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.


