To Vacate a Public Parcel

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Jerry Gates, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of city property near Lake Lemon; and

WHEREAS, IC $36-7-3-512$ requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of city owned property near Lake Lemon shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows: A part of the Southeast Quarter of Section Thirty-four (34), Township Ten (10) North, Range One (1) East, bounded and described as follows, to wit: Commencing at a point that is Fifty Hundreths (0.50) feet west of the Southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of said Section Thirty-four (34), thence running North Thirty-seven (37) degrees and Thirty (30) minutes West for a distance of One Hundred Four and Seven tenths (104.7) feet; thence running North Sixty-six (66) degrees West for a distance of Fifty-five and one-tenth (55.10) feet to the true point of beginning; thence North sixty-six (66) degrees West for a distance of Twenty-four and Thirty-five hundreths (24.35) feet; thence North Twenty-seven (27) degrees Thirty Three (33) minutes EAst for a distance of Nine and Fifty-nine hundreths (9.59) feet; thence South SixtyTwo (62) degrees Twenty-seven (27) minutes East for a distance of Twentyfour and three tenths (24.30) feet; thence South Twenty-seven (27) degrees Thirty-three (33) minutes West for a distance of Eight and Nine Hundreths (8.09) feet, and to the point of beginning, containing Two Hundred and Fourteen and Eighty-six hundreths (214.86) square feet, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
