

ORDINANCE 83-36

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-29-83, and recommended that the petitioner, Professional Golfcar, Inc., be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RE to ML for property located at the northwest corner of Fullerton Pike and the 37 Bypass and more particularly described as follows:

A part of the West half of the Southwest quarter of Section 18, Township 8 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County, Indiana, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the West line of said Half-Quarter Section that is 871.92 feet South 00 degrees 14 minutes 08 seconds East of the Northwest corner of said Half-Quarter Section, said point being the intersection point of the West line of said Half-Quarter with the West right of way of State Road 37, thence South 00 degrees 17 minutes 35 seconds East over and along the West line of said Half-Quarter for a distance of 1763.43 feet to a point on the North line of Fullerton Pike, said point also being a point on the right-of way of State Road 37, thence over and along said right of way by the following courses and distances: North 75 degrees 05 minutes 58 seconds East, 129.81 feet; South 89 degrees 15 minutes 30 seconds East, 200.00 feet; North 45 degrees 21 minutes 01 seconds East, 116.91 feet; thence Northwesterly 999.67 feet along an arc to the right and having a radius of 5874.58 feet and subtended by a long chord having a bearing of North 17 degrees 18 minutes 56 seconds West and a length of 998.47 feet; thence North 14 degrees 13 minutes 47 seconds West, 205.47 feet; thence Northwesterly 503.10 feet along an arc to the right and having a radius of 5884.58 feet and subtended by a long chord having a bearing of North 7 degrees 59 minutes 28 seconds West and a length of 502.95 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 6.92 acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
