ORDINANCE 83 - 38

To Vacate a Public Parcel

- WHEREAS. IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and
- WHEREA'S, the petitioner, Evelyn S. Clark, has filed a petition to vacate a parcel of City property on the alley behind 328 South Euclid; and
- WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 36-7-3-12, a portion of City-owned property on the alley behind 328 South Euclid shall be vacated. The property is more particularly described as follows:

A part of Seminary Lot Number 49 in the City of Bloomington, Indiana, beginning at a point that is 253.44 feet South of the Northwest corner of said Seminary Lot No. 49, thence east for 41.50 feet and to the true point of beginning, thence running South for 253 feet, thence East for 10 feet, thence North for 253 feet, thence West for 10 feet and to the true point of beginning.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND DECREED that Public Service Company of Indiana, Inc., an Indiana corporation, Indiana Bell Telephone, and other utilities, as necessary, their successors and assigns, shall be and are hereby granted the perpetual easement and right to construct, operate, patrol, maintain, reconstruct, and remove an electric line, or other necessary utility fixtures, including necessary poles, wires, anchors, guys and fixtures attached thereto, together with the right of ingress and egress to said easement, for the transmission of electrical energy or other utilities over, along, under, or across the following described real property situated in Monroe County, State of Indiana, to-wit:

A strip of land ten (10) feet in width, and two hundred forty-nine and twotenths (249.2) feet in length, the ease line of which strip of land begins at the Southwest Corner of Lot Number 16 in Prospect Park, Second Addition, to the City of Bloomington; thence north, on, along, adjacent to, and west of, the west property line of said Lot Number 16, and Lot Number 14 to a point, said point being the Northwest Corner of said Lot Number 14 in said Addition; thence continuing north across an alley a distance of ten (10) feet to the Southwest Corner of Lot Number 12 of said Addition; thence north on, along, adjacent to, and west of, the west property line of said Lot Number 12, and Lot Number 10 to a point, said point being the Northwest Corner of said Lot Number 10 in said Addition.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and published according to law.
