

ORDINANCE 83-51

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-55-83, and recommended that the petitioner, MAY MITCHELL, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RH to ML for property located at 1731 South Park Street, more particularly described as follows:

A part of the South end of Lot Number Ninety-two (92) in Barclay Gardens, being a sub-division of the West half of the Northeast quarter, and part of the Northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter and part of the East one-half of the Northeast quarter, and part of the North one-half of the Northwest quarter of Section Nine (9), Township Eight (8) North, Range One (1) West: the part of said Lot Number Ninety-two (92) herein described being the South end, and being one hundred sixty-two (162) feet in depth on the West line of said lot, and one hundred fifty-seven (157) feet deep on the East line of said lot.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
