- WHEREAS, east will meet west in the near future through the Third Street underpass, which was brought from grant proposal to reality by John; and
- WHEREAS, his clear principles, his capacity to listen, his balance, his clarity of thought, his objectivity, his even temper, and his sense of humor are characteristics which are honored by all of those who have worked with John; and
- WHEREAS, as politicians we are sensitive to the fact that John Freeman is related to one-half of the voters in Monroe County and is a close personal friend of the other half;
