ORDINANCE 82-4

To Amend Section 20.13.01.07 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, Entitled "Approval of Outline Plan"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOM-INGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. The following section of Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled "Approval of Outline Plan" be amended to read as follows:

20.13.01.07 Approval of outline plan. Application for approval of the outline plan of planned developments shall be submitted to the plan commission in accordance with the rules of procedure of the commission. The plan department shall review any such outline plan and forward a report to the plan commission based upon the criteria for approval contained in Sections 20.13.01 and 20.13.02 and such other planning concepts as may be deemed pertinent. The plan department report shall be made available as a public record in the plan department office.

(a) Upon conclusion of its public hearings the plan commission shall forward to the Bloomington city council its recommendations together with the plan department's report and such other documents as may be pertinent to the planned development.

(b) The city council shall conduct a public hearing on the planned development application.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance would amend the zoning code to eliminate the requirement that staff reports on outline plans be available fifteen days before Plan Commission action and that the Council act within thirty days of the Plan Commission's recommendation after publishing notice. The result is that planned developments would be processed by the same requirements as other zoning requests.
