

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, Z0-70-81, and recommended that the petitioner, Commercial Investment Company, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from Limited Business (BL) to General Business (BG) for property located at 309 W. Howe more particularly described as follows:

Howe addition North 1/2 of lots 19 and 20, also the entire part lots 21 and 22. Also the vacated alley right-of-way described as follows:  
to wit: Beginning at a point on the northeast corner of lot 20 in Howe Addition, thence east twelve (12) feet to the northwest corner of lot 21 thence south one-hundred twenty-six (126) feet to the southwest corner of lot 21 thence west six (6) feet, thence north sixty-three (63) feet thence west six (6) feet, thence north sixty-three (63) feet to the point of beginning.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
