#### ORDINANCE 82 - 10

DEFEATED 2/17/82

To Vacate A Portion Of Public Alley Located At Grant St. To Dunn St. Between Third and Fourth Streets

WHEREAS, IC 36-7-3-12 authorizes the Common Council to vacate public ways and places upon petition of persons who own or are interested in lots contiguous to those public ways and places; and

WHEREAS, the petitioner, Ira B. Zinman, has filed a petition to vacate the public alley located adjacent to 213 S. Grant St.; and

WHEREAS, IC-36-7-4-512 requires the Plan Commission to make a recommendation on the proposed vacation and to forward it to the Common Council; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this petition and made a favorable recommendation on its adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC-36-7-3-12, the public alley shall be vacated that is located adjacent to 213 S. Grant St., more particualarly described as follows:

An alley adjacent to the north side of a part of In Lot Seven (7) in Bloomington, Indiana bounded as follows: Commencing at the Northwest corner of said In Lot Seven (7); thence South fifty-six (56) feet; thence East sixty-six (66) feet; thence North fifty-six (56) feet; thence West sixty-six (66) feet to the place of beginning.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Major, fand published according to law.
